1. Business arising

• The York U-TD Community Engagement Centre is pleased to welcome our new manager, Mr. Byron Gray. Byron is known to many in the Jane Finch community through his work for the past 10 years at the Jane Finch Community and Family Centre. Over these years he has been instrumental in the creation of dynamic youth programming and leadership development throughout the Jane Finch Community and beyond. He brings knowledge and experience with the broader social service sector as a senior manager and through his active involvement with the United Way, the TDSB, and youth serving networks. He has been an inspirational mentor and teacher as a field placement instructor and supervisor over many years, including at Centennial College and with York University. Byron has been a strong community advocate for the York U-TD Community Engagement Centre since its inception, and we know he will provide visionary and inclusive leadership to bring us to the next stage of growth at the Centre. Join me in welcoming Byron to this role. He will begin on July 3.

2. Financial Literacy and Education Savings Week

- a. How do we build awareness, connect community, get people to open RESP? Timeline is FL month and education saving week (the week of Nov. 19). 4000 kids in this neighbourhood are eligible, determined by first 3 postal code digits, by tax filing.
- b. Some ideas gathered include: people's lack of understanding of this. Difficulty to maintain an account. The banks as a barrier as CLB is not accessible through all the agencies, only the big banks. Is the message clear enough? "Imagine what this money could do for your kids." Try to get the parents to see the future. Ask parents that already use Canada Learning Bond To tell their stories to other parents. Emphasize the future, and that the money can be used towards ANY TRAINING. Important to gain trust from the parents, leverage someone that community is already familiar with and trusts (i.e., church or MPP) Come to York to talk to students who have kids. Give away free calculation sheets. Conduct focus groups of parents to find out what's holding them back. Use easy to understand information that's not too text heavy for communication.
- c. Jill will set up a phone call to continue the discussion for people who are interested in helping.

3. 2018 Workplan Refinement

- a. Evaluation and education
 - i. Chris reached out to Credit Canada to interview workers, not sure when it will take place.

b. Advocacy

i. Tamara has 5 cases, needs to type them out. The scenarios are about people having barriers to accessing the banks, complex cases, the whole climate, timeline is end of July. **ACTION ITEM**

ii. Loretta prefers to pull cases from different communities, check with Tanya as she's with Jane and Finch. **ACTION ITEM** (Brenda to connect Loretta with Tanya)

c. Capacity building

- i. Angie to share ABLE Conference resources with the group. (Done)
- ii. Agreed that Tamara will be the backup person for future FL Networks phone conferences if the co-chairs are not available.

4. Updates from organizations and other

Brenda provided an update on the projects she's working on with the students. Alec is working on OSAP repayment, researching more ways for repayments, structuring a paper to get the conversation going to get the message out for people who go through the process. Alec has the idea of a podcast, how do we communicate?

- iii. Brenda and Monica Da Ponte received \$30,000 grant from RBC to assess Monica's fin lit curriculum/delivery. Monica delivers, Brenda evaluate. The workshops will be offered in the winter 2019 term.
- iv. Loretta is putting together an outline for a radio program, she has previous experience.
- v. Barry provided an update on Black Creek Mirco-credit, the staff won't be back soon, if he's not back by August his position will be reposted.
